How to "dress up" a song

So, you've got a song, and you want to make it sound more like it sounds when the original artist plays it. Now, how do you go about it?

I'm still learning how to do this myself, but there are a number of things you can do. Among them:

- 1. Insert melody notes, either alone or as modifications to chords
- 2. Use chord inversions and chords in other positions
- 3. Substitute chords

Let's work with an example from the Beatles: While My Guitar Gently Weeps. I'm sure everyone is familiar with this. If not, Jake Shimabukuro has an incredible version of it. A good video of the performance can be found at http://ukuleledisco.com/jake.

You won't sound anything remotely like that after going through this document, but you should be able to produce something more recognizable than an accompaniment strum. First, let's look at our starting point (it's where *I* started with this song). We'll begin by using chords that are all in the first few frets.


This is not the clearest photo, but it should be sufficient. There are three sections to the page ... up at the top, there are guitar chord diagrams. Ignore them - we're talking ukulele here! In the center is what's called a lead sheet. It shows the chords and the melody line (the chords are only noted by name, and not by notation). The bottom section shows the lyrics, the chords, and a strum pattern to give you the beat.


A word on chord notation: since I don't have anything that will produce chord diagrams to use in this document, I'll specify chords and notes by listing the frets pressed for each string in order from the G. In other words, an F chord would be 2010, a simple G would be 0232, and so on. An 'x' in a string's position indicates that you would not use that string, so xxx3 would be just the high C note from a simple C chord.

The song starts on an Am chord (2000) after one "pick-up" note. If you aren't familiar with the terminology, a pick-up note is one at the beginning of a song that is not part of a complete measure. This song is in common (4/4) time, denoted by the "c" just to the right of the treble clef. This means that each measure will contain four quarter-notes or the equivalent, so the eighth note (an E - we'll use this fact later) in the measure by itself is a pick-up note.

Leaving the notation for a moment, and going to the lyrics and strum pattern, we see that the first line starts with Am (2000), then C6 (0000), followed by D (2220), Dm (2210), Am (2000) again, then G (0232), D (2220), and E (4442).

The second line is very similar, replacing the D (2220), E (4442) finish with a C (0003), E (4442) finish.

The third and fourth lines use the same chord progression: A (2100), C#m (6444), F#m (2124), Bm (4222), and E (4442).

The fifth line repeats the chord progression of the first line, and the sixth is the same, but it leaves off the final E chord.

Basically, there is one chord progression for lines one, two, five, and six (with the last one modified for the song ending), and another chord progression for lines three and four. The first chord progression is often referred to as the "A part," and the second is similarly referred to as the "B part." Fiddle tunes often involve an A part that is repeated twice alternating with a B part that is also repeated twice.

In any case, now that we've covered the ukulele chords for the song, try running through that a few more times (you *did* work through it already to see how it sounds, didn't you?). You'll want to know your starting point before things get changed, just like you'd follow a recipe a few times before changing the ingredients.

Back now?I'm guessing it was more-or-less recognizable, and you were OK until you got to the F#m. Apart from that one, all of the chord fingerings are pretty simple, and the C#m to F#m transition poses a pretty tricky finger repositioning problem to deal with, so we'll take care of that before we do anything else. The way to deal with that F#m is to use a chord inversion up the neck that's easier to get to from the C#m. The detailed way to find a chord inversion is to determine which notes form the chord, and then find a different fingering pattern up the neck that provides the same notes (by letter, not necessarily the exact same notes). I'm going to skip that for now.

I presume you're familiar with the simple Em chord (0432). A small change will make that a movable chord form (one that uses all four strings, so the same finger positioning can be used in various positions up and down the neck to produce different chords. In this case, fretting the G string at the fourth fret produces the movable form of Em (4432). Moving it one fret up the neck produces an Fm (5543), and one fret higher than that produces F#m (6654). You can see the notes it has in common with the C#m

(6444) - the G and A strings are the same. Therefore, the way to deal with this is to barre at the fourth fret with your index finger (lay your index finger across all four strings and press them down) and fret the G at the 6th with your ring finger for the C#m, then put your middle and pinkie fingers down when you need the F#m, and pick them back up again to go back to the C#m. Try it.

Works better, doesn't it. Much easier transition. Now, we're going to put in a little melody, with chords as well as individual notes.

Earlier, I noted that the pick-up note was an E. We have a string that produces an E when it's hit (or plucked, if you prefer). It is, wonder of wonders, the E string. So, we'll start the song by hitting the E string, then strumming the Am (2000) chord. As you look at the lyrics, the E note is on the word "I," and the Am is on "look." Now look at the notation. The Am on "look" is the half note in the first full measure. The words "at" and "you" are the quarter notes on B and C in that same measure. We can get those easily on the A string at frets 2 and 3, respectively. That gives us this:

Am

(xx0x)I (2000)look (xxx2)at (xxx3)you

You could also do it this way, since the Am is held:

Am

(xx0x)I (2000)look (2002)at (2003)you

I tend to fret the G string for the Am chord with my middle finger, and use the ring and pinkie to fret the B and C notes on the G string. You may find it easier to fret the chord some other way. Whatever works for you.

Next, you should see that "all see the" and "love there that's" have the same B and C notes on the second and third words, and only the chords change. When you get to the D chord (2220), I find that I fret it with three fingers, rather than a partial barre, so it's easiest for me to get the B note by laying my ring finger (which is fretting the E string) down to cover the A string, as well. Then I fret the C with my pinkie again. Run through that much of the first line a few times to familiarize yourself with the fingerings and the resulting sound.

The word "sleeping" takes a measure by itself. The chord is Dm (2210), but the notes are a D and C that are higher than the simple Dm produces. We'll use two tricks here: first, we'll use the inversion of the Dm that's found at the 5th fret (7555) for "sleep", and then we'll substitute an F chord inversion (5553) for "ing."

Next, we go back to Am (2000) just before the word "while," which is on an E an octave above the first note of the song. We could pick up that E at the 12th fret on the E string (12 frets make an octave), but it's easier to pick it up at the 7th fret on the A string. Since

E is one of the notes (C, E, and G) that make up a C chord, you can either pick the note by itself (I usually do) or strum across (0007) for a C chord.

The next note (on "my") is a C. Since the underlying chord is still Am, and Am is the relative minor of the C chord, I usually just strum a full C chord (5433) here. You could strum an Am with a high C (2003), or just a simple C (0003). I prefer the sound of the full C chord to the simple C chord, myself, and I find the Am with high C sounds quite good, but it's a bit trickier fingering than I want to deal with.

The measure finishes with an A note for "gui." You can pick the A string (xxx0) or strum an open C6 (0000) to get that, then strum a G chord (0232) for "tar." We get the B note there for free, since the G chord is built from the G, B, and E notes (I'm not going to get into chord formation here). For the next two notes ("gen-tly"), I drop the B from the G chord (strumming 0230 to get the A), then bring the B note back in (0232). I don't do anything fancy for the D or E chords.

The second line goes the same way up to the G chord. Then, instead of dropping the B note, I move my ring finger (which is fretting the E string at the 3rd fret) over to the 3rd fret of the A string and pick the C note, then fret the A string at the 5th fret and pick the D note, then strum a full C chord (5433) and slide it up to the E chord (9877).

Now on to the B part.

We start on an A chord (2100). Taking the full G chord (4232) and moving it up two frets (6454) produces an A chord that sounds better here, but staying with the basic A chord allows us to pick up a bit more melody:

A (2104)I (2102)don't (2104) know

Moving from Bm to E can be done fairly simply if you have the right flexibility in your fingers: barre the 4th fret and fret the G string with your ring finger for the Bm, then press the first joint of your ring finger down on the C and E strings to get the E chord.

If you're willing to switch fingers around, you can pick up more melody in that last line:

Bm E (4222)how to (4224)un(4227)fold(4222) (4224)your (4442)love

Tricky, and I'm still trying to get it down myself, but it sounds nice.

Repeat for the fourth line, then finish by repeating the first two lines again, leaving off the final E chord.

So, putting it all together, this is what we've got:
